EMF EXPANSION INCREASES METROLINK'S OVERNIGHT TRAIN STORAGE AND MAINTENANCE CAPABILITIES

The San Bernardino Associated Governments (SANBAG), one of five member agencies that funds Metrolink service, completed the expansion of Metrolink's Eastern Maintenance Facility (EMF) in September. The facility is expected to be operational in early 2014. The yearlong \$10.3 million construction project increased the overnight storage and maintenance capability of the Colton facility from five train consists* to 15. The EMF will also allow Metrolink to move a portion of its maintenance operations performed at its Central Maintenance Facility near downtown Los Angeles.

The project is also integral to SANBAG's planned extension of the Metrolink San Bernardino Line into downtown San Bernardino, slated to begin construction in early 2014. Metrolink trains had been stored overnight at the current San Bernardino Line terminus at the historic San Bernardino Santa Fe Depot (Depot). The EMF expansion will help make room at the San Bernardino terminus for the upcoming San Bernardino Line extension, which will require the reconfiguration of platform tracks at the Depot.

Construction efforts to expand the EMF included installation of approximately 9,000 lineal feet of railroad track, requiring the replacement of a 25 foot-long section of the existing Lytle Creek Channel with a concrete box culvert structure and extension of an existing bridge structure. The bridge extension spans the existing concrete channel across the project site and is placed on cast-in-drilled-hole (CIDH) concrete piles. Improvements also required raising portions of the existing grade by approximately two feet, relocating existing utilities, installing an on-site drainage system, underground water, sewer, gas, electric lines, water hydrants, lighting and spare conduits and adding a safety feature of a train retarder.

UPDATE ON L.A. UNION STATION FARE ENFORCEMENT INITIATIVE

In the last issue of *Metrolink Matters*, we told you about a new fare enforcement initiative we rolled out July 1. It entailed Metrolink customer engagement representatives (CERs) and security guards inspecting passenger tickets at 85 percent of the trains prior to their departure, as well as Metrolink sheriffs and security guards inspecting tickets on board the remaining 15 percent of the trains after departure. Additionally, Metrolink CERs and security guards inspected tickets at 100 percent of the trains on weekends.

After receiving rider feedback, we modified our fare inspection process to improve the quality of service Metrolink security guards and sheriffs provide to riders. We previously opened the doors to every other train car and inspected tickets prior to passengers boarding the trains. In early September, we began checking passenger tickets in the tunnels leading up to the platforms, which has allowed us to open all train doors so passengers can quickly board any car they prefer after their tickets have been inspected. This modified process has also allowed us to inspect tickets for 100 percent of the trains during the week, compared to 85 percent when we first introduced the initiative. Additionally, Metrolink sheriffs continue to inspect rider tickets on board the trains after departure.

We also posted new signage in the tunnels and on the platforms to alert Metrolink riders that they must have valid tickets before entering the platforms and boarding the trains.

Thank you for your input in helping us to improve this process. We appreciate your patience and cooperation as we work to ensure that every rider has valid fare.

AMTRAK® BICYCLE POLICY REMINDER FOR RAIL 2 RAIL® RIDERS



Metrolink Monthly Pass holders who ride Amtrak as part of the Rail 2 Rail program may not board Pacific Surfliner® trains with bicycles without purchasing an Amtrak ticket and reserving a bike slot in advance of their trip. Amtrak tickets and bike reservations can be obtained by visiting Amtrak.com, from station ticket agents, at Quik-Trak ticketing kiosks (starting November 1), or by calling 1-800-USA-RAIL (872-7245).

Please use Metrolink trains if your commute requires bicycle transport. Metrolink operates special Bike Cars on select trains (refer to Metrolink "All Lines Timetable"), and all passenger cars are designed to hold three bikes each.

NOTICE TO RIDERS WHO BOARD AT WEST CORONA STATION:



GRADE SEPARATION PROJECT TO IMPACT COMMUTE TO STATION

Construction for the Auto Center Drive grade separation in Corona continues. There is only one traffic lane open in each direction on Auto Center Drive between Pomona Road and Railroad Street and on Railroad Street between Monica Circle and Auto Center Drive. Metrolink encourages riders who board at the West Corona Station to allow for extra time when commuting to the station or take an alternate route to the station.

The Riverside County Transportation Commission, one of the five member agencies that fund Metrolink service, and the City of Corona are completing the grade separation.

A four-lane over crossing is being constructed at the Burlington Northern Santa Fe railroad tracks, which intersects with Auto Center Drive. The project will reduce traffic congestion in the area and improve public safety by separating railroad traffic from automobile traffic.

Construction for the \$26 million project began in August 2013 and is expected to be completed in June 2015.

Instructions for Emergency Evacuation

In the Event of an Emergency:

- ▶▶ **1 Move to the next car, or**
Use the connecting end doors at the immediate levels of each car to enter the leading or following car. Connecting train doors are *depicted in blue*.
- ▶▶ **2 If you cannot exit through the end doors, exit the train through the side doors, or**
Side doors should only be used if you cannot exit through the end doors. Side doors are *depicted in green*.
- ▶▶ **3 If you cannot exit through the side doors, exit through the emergency exit windows.**
Emergency exit windows should only be used if you cannot exit through the side doors. Emergency exit windows are *depicted in orange*.

DOORS

- ▶▶ **1** Break plastic cover to access red triangle.
- ▶▶ **2** Pull red triangle down to release both door panels.
- ▶▶ **3** Grip rubber between door panels and slide one or both panels open.
- ▶▶ **4** Look out of doorway for obstacles. Exit with caution.

WINDOWS

- ▶▶ **1** Pull red handles on rubber using both hands.
- ▶▶ **2** Pull window handles using both hands.
- ▶▶ **3** Carefully remove window and place it out of the way. Window weighs approximately 70 pounds. Exit with caution.

SB LINE SIX-CAR TRAIN SETS TO BE REDUCED WHILE PTC INSTALLATION UNDER WAY

All six-car Metrolink trains on the San Bernardino Line will be reduced to five-car sets. Metrolink is implementing the service adjustment to incorporate critically needed Positive Train Control (PTC) safety technology on its locomotives.

The proposed effective date is Monday, Nov. 4. The service adjustment will remain in effect for at least two years.

Other factors leading to the service adjustment are the planned San Bernardino Line service expansion and renovation to the historic Santa Fe Depot, which are expected to begin in early 2014.
